DESTINATION JOY by Alberita Johnson, Minister



Greetings All Faiths Family,

As a senior citizen, I've noticed how quickly time seems to pass. It feels like only yesterday that I became a Commissioned Lay Minister, then a Contract Lay Minister at All Faiths. Yet, on September 1st of this year, I celebrated two years as your minister.

While planning October's Sunday Service, I was delighted to discover that Clergy Appreciation Day also falls in that month. I spoke with Joyce Ramay, co-chair of the Sunday Service Team, about an appreciation service for the All Faiths staff and volunteers. Regina then reminded me that past appreciation celebrations were held off-site, perhaps at a park, among the All Faiths

community. My plans were, therefore, set aside. However, you all surprised me with your own beautifully planned and executed celebration. Thank you for your support of me as your minister on Clergy Appreciation Day, Sunday, October 12th. I am truly grateful.

My time as your minister has brought immense growth. Some lessons came easily, others were incredibly difficult, but I am grateful for both. One significant lesson is the patience to persevere, even through pain, or, as a Buddhist might say, suffering. I believe I'm not alone in thinking that commitment to a person, cause, or even a thing requires patience and perseverance. It demands a willingness to set aside ego, confront pain, hurt, and difficulty, and ask, "How can I help?"

I've faced that question when looking into the eyes of others, perhaps even yours. But as your minister, the eyes I truly need to face are my own.

"How can I help me?" As my first UU minister, Rev. Allison Farnum, used to say, "Just Keep on Keepin' on." And that is precisely what I've decided to do. With all I can muster with love for All Faiths.

Each month, we will focus and highlight our theme in Sunday Service including Music, Children and Youth Programming, Social Media, and Small Groups. They are designed to inspire us to personal application, and external action that positively affects the Beloved Community inside our doors and out.

This month's theme is "Nurturing Gratitude." As poet and philosopher, Mark Nepo, puts it: "The original meaning of the word "appreciate" means to move toward what is precious. So practicing gratitude reengages our aliveness—they awaken us to what is precious."

If we listen carefully to the call of gratitude, we will hear a challenge to change our lives, not just appreciate them. So friends, as we weave our way through this month's journey, may we carry with us the

We are now entering the last two months of 2025. What a year it has been! The last ten months have brought about many unexpected and concerning changes, which have fueled our insecurities and filled our lives with worry and angst. All Faiths is a sanctuary where we can escape those concerns and be among family and friends and fill our hearts for the week ahead. We are like a "spiritual gas station" for when we're feeling empty inside. Here, we can renew our spirit with inspiring messages, energizing music, surrounded by an engaging community, that keeps us going for another week. The sense of belonging and expressions of love and support help enrich our hearts. I encourage everyone to reach out, get involved with each other, and participate in various activities at All Faiths. The more engaged we are, the more togetherness we feel and the more powerful and energized we become. This is our way to be each other's keeper. This will help maintain our sanity during these trying times.

Board Meeting Updates

This is a busy time for your Board of Directors. We are working to develop a proposed budget for the 2026/2027 fiscal year which starts in April 2026. The Finance Committee starts the process by working tirelessly to scrutinize our current expenditures and looking for ways to cut costs, while also making room for new

ideas and ways to accommodate increased expenses. It is a balancing act finding ways to grow and improve the Congregation while also looking to minimizing costs. We are very fortunate to have highly skilled and respected members on the Finance Team who have many years of experience in this process and who hold their financial responsibility to the Congregation sacred. During this process, The Board provides direction, guidance and oversight.

The budget is then approved by the Board of Directors. After that, the Stewardship Committee begins the Annual Pledge Drive to raise funds to meet our goal. More information will be shared during this process.

The Board continues to work on the Building Expansion as well as the various Building & Grounds improvements discussed in my last newsletter article. If you have any questions on these matters, please see me.

- 1. Patio repair, power washing and clear coating
- 2. Replacing the sidewalk between the outside wall of the office and the memorial garden
- 3. Build a retaining wall around the memorial garden
- 4. Installing a solar light for the new street sign

I want to remind everyone that All Faiths Board meetings are held monthly on the 2nd Tuesday of every month at 1pm and are open to all members, if anyone wishes to observe.

Recent Events:

- 1. Our recent Clergy Appreciation Day went very well and was much appreciated. Thank you to all who helped contribute to its success. I know that Albie was very touched by your appreciation.
- 2. I want to thank all of those who were instrumental in designing, building and setting up the All Faiths scarecrow that was on display at the Lakes Park Scarecrow event. We may not have won any awards, but it was FABULOUS, nonetheless. Our name and message were seen by over 50,000 people who attended the event.
- 3. The Racial Equity team has begun its work to support the Quality Life Center in a couple ways. Several members participated in their Fall Festival held in October, by hosting a booth where they passed out candy and "fidget spinner" toys to about 100 kids at the festival. The team also sponsored a "Smore's Party" at the festival by supplying all the marshmallows, graham crackers and Hershey bars for the party.

Upcoming Events:

- 1. All Faiths will host an active shooter training course conducted by the Lee County Sheriff's office. It will be followed by a Security Presentation & a review of our facility and current safety procedures. Everyone is welcome to attend this event. It starts at 1pm on Tuesday, November 4th.
- 2. The Board is looking into the possibility of having two Sunday Services as we contin-

- ue to grow in membership and our ability to accommodate parking and seating requirements become limited. Prior to COVID, we had two services during the busy season. One at 9am and another at 11am with time in between for fellowship and to hold training sessions as needed. More information will be shared as it becomes necessary.
- 3. All Faiths will be celebrating 25 years since its founding. We call it Founders' Day. Please reserve Saturday, February 21, 2026, as this will be a major event in the life of the congregation.
- 4. Fall Clean Up of our facility is scheduled for Saturday, November 15th, we could use all hands to make this happen.
- 5. The monthly Night Market at the Alliance for the Arts will be Wednesday, November 12th from 5 to 8pm. If you are interested, please see Carole Latino or me.

Congregational Needs:

- 1. All Faiths is looking to hire a dedicated person to work on the sound board during Sunday services. Prior experience is preferred but not required. Anyone interested please let us know.
- 2. Anyone interested in helping to plan an All Faiths Outdoor Festival, please let me know. This event would include hamburgers and hotdogs as well as a mini golf course and other activities. This was originally scheduled for October, but now it may become a Winter or Spring event.

Revenue/Operating Income and Expenses:

As we entered the new 2025-2026 fiscal year on April 1, All Faiths budgeted \$202,086 for pledge giving; to date, actual Not Alone pledges totaled \$185,160 (86.9%).

In September, we received \$13,108.17 in pledge giving towards our Not Alone Pledge Drive. And in the fiscal year that just ended, \$28,412.63 was received for the Not Alone pledge drive.

Year to date (since April 1), our pledge giving has totaled \$83,978.12, while we budgeted \$101,046.00 (83.1%).

No unusual expenses were incurred in the General Fund Operating Account during September.

September's Interest Income was \$406.75.

At the beginning of the 2023-2024 fiscal year, several new accounts were created at Live Oak to generate increased interest income. The 1 Year CD rate is 4.1%. And the Savings rate is currently at 3.15%.

The September monthly transfer/deposit of \$1,640.00 to the Live Oak Capital Reserve account was made. A \$1,250 payment to the architect was made for design services for the building renovation project.

In September, \$370.00 was collected for the SWFL RESET (Climate Action Team).


