

## Women's History Month at All Faiths Unitarian Congregation Herstories...

Women's History Month is a celebration of the contributions of women to history, culture, and society. It is celebrated in March in the United States, the United Kingdom, and Australia, and in October in Canada.

In the United States it was 1978 when the Sonoma County Commission on the Status of Women in California organized a Women's History Week, and the following year President Jimmy Carter proclaimed the week of March 8,1979 as the first National Women's history week, and in 1980 it expanded to a month and finally in 1987, Congress passed a resolution establishing March as Women's History Month.

Here at All Faiths we got started early, offering Rise Up and Call Her Name, a 13 week journey with the Divine Feminine and offering a very successful fundraiser, The Vaginia Monlogues in February. Both of these offerings are designed to remove unexplained shame and fear of female deities and the female anatomy by shining a light on the many untold herstories.

According to census data 50.4% of the U.S. population is female and yet many of herstories remain untold. This year

the theme for Women's Herstory Month is, "Women who advocate for Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion," last year it was "Celebrating Women Who Tell Our Stories."

- Revenue/Operating Income and Expenses:
- No unusual expenses were incurred. Budget control was good in January.
- Our Pledge Goal for 2023-2024 (April to March) was \$183,268 and as of 2/20/2024 \$172,300.20 (94%) has been received. Thank you for your generosity!
- Several new accounts were created at Live Oak to generate increased interest income. The 1 Year CD rate is 5.0%. And the Savings rate is currently at 4.0%.
- The monthly transfer/deposit of \$1,250.00 to the Live Oak Capital Reserve account was made. A contract has been issued to repave the parking lot and we now expect that this work will be completed by March 2024. In addition, we have contracted for new front doors and a new side door which we expect to have installed in March. There were no Capital expenses in January.
- In January, \$715.00 was collected for Quality Life Center (Racial Equity Team).

### **QUILT AUCTION/SALE**

Diane and Doug Cartwright have taken pictures and put together a catalogue of the twelve quilts that the Elrods have entrusted to All Faiths for sale, 10% of the proceeds to go to All Faiths.

They envision that sometime after the quilt raffle for "The Women of

Islam," they can have either a sale or a silent auction to offer the quilts/wall hangings. The Cartwrights tentatively priced them at beginning bids ranging from \$50 to \$150, but would expect them to sell for more in a silent auction or a sale of some kind as they range in size and intricacy of work.

As far as the details, it is up to the Board to decide when and where and the particulars of the sale, but Ed and Carol have expressed to me that they are comfortable with whatever is decided. Diane and Doug will list the unsold quilts on eBay at no cost to either party; but eBay takes about 15% in listing fees, taxes, and shipping costs so it would be better for all concerned to sell them through All Faiths. The catalogue will be made available on Sundays to look over, if you wish.

The Heart for the Homeless Team will be conducting a "T-Shirt Drive" on the first two Sundays in March, March 3 and March 10.


We are asking All Faiths Members & Friends to donate any good used T-shirts that a homeless person could wear.
