DESTINATION JOY by Alberita Johnson, CL Minister



This short month of February is most notably known as the month of love, wherein we celebrate Valentine's Day. In this 21st Century, I would like to think that we here at All Faiths Unitarian Congregation are aware of the history of St. Valentine and that it is shrouded in mystery and legend.

This reminds me of the Divine Feminine, another legendary and mysterious subject. However, this month we will take a dive into the Divine Feminine, and host a delightful, yet controversial play called the *Vagina Monologues*. The playwright Eve Ensler wrote the first draft of the monologues in 1996 following interviews she conducted with 200 women about their views on sex, relationships, and violence against women, which later blossomed into an international global non-profit movement that has raised over \$100 million for groups working to end violence against women, including those whose identities are fluid and are subject to gender-based violence.

We are also launching an experiential 13-week course on the Divine Feminine called *Rise Up and Call Her Name*, which will begin Valentine's Day (Feb. 14, 2024), facilitated by Helen Dixon and myself during *10 O'clock Scholar* on Wednesday mornings at 10:00 a.m. This course is for women only and those who identify as women. The course

is already full and we may need to repeat it at a later date.

But no worries - if you have not signed up, or if you do not identify as a woman, or are just not interested, we invite you to take advantage of *News Talk* on Sunday mornings, 9:15 a.m.- 10:00 a.m. This is a small group who loosely discuss topics in the news. Currently we have no official facilitator, but there are a few committed individuals who come together during our Sunday morning *News Talk*. However, it is our hope to formalize Sunday *News Talk* and offer it as an ad hoc *Civil Discourse Group* that will include debates with factual contents. If you are interested in being a part of this more formalized civil discourse, please join us Sunday mornings as we plan to make it happen.

I am looking forward to both of these offerings here at All Faiths, as they are needed and necessary experiences to move us towards a more just and loving community, filled with leaning inward and demonstrating outward our UUA values of Interdependence, Equity, Transformation (no fear of changes), Pluralism, Generosity, and Justice - all centered in Love.

Remember we have a destination in mind...to find joy in our offerings.



QUILT AUCTIONS TO BENEFIT ALL FAITHS

All Faiths has been presented with a generous gift and an opportunity to hold a unique fundraiser. Ed and Carol Elrod have donated her award winning quilted wall hanging, "The Women of Islam," to be raffled off as a fundraiser, the entire proceeds to go toward All Faiths. In addition, Ed and Carol have donated 10% of the profits generated by a second quilt sale/auction/raffle (details yet to be announced) featuring about twenty of her hand-made quilted wall hangings of various sizes. After the Founders' Day raffle drawing, further details will be announced and a catalogue of pictures and sizes of her quilts will be made available as well as a display of the quilts in the social hall.

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

Celebrate All Faiths!

The All Faiths 2024-25 Pledge Campaign was kicked off at the January 14th service. The theme, *Celebrate All Faiths*, was chosen to encourage each of us to think about what we value about All Faiths and why we support it. An email blast was sent on January 17th giving recipients an option to pledge on-line.

Pledges are the main source of income for All Faiths' 2024-2025 fiscal year. Using data from this year's expenses, the Finance Committee developed a budget that includes known increases in basic costs (e.g., insurance and utilities) plus other anticipated increases for things such as office supplies, building maintenance costs, etc. The draft budget also estimates income that will be received from pledges and other sources such as cash donations, rental of the building to outside groups, fundraisers and interest earned. Pledges are All Faiths largest source of income; to have a balanced budget, next year's pledges must total \$200,200. To achieve that goal, current pledges will have to increase by 11.6%.

You can fulfill your pledge in a manner that best suits your budget: in one lump sum or by breaking your payment into weekly, monthly, or quarterly payments. No pledge is too big or too small! Every pledge is needed... is important ... and is appreciated.

Please pledge by February 13th so the Finance Committee can prepare a realistic budget adjusted to reflect the amount of pledges received. If pledges fall short of the \$200,200 pledge goal, expenditures will have to be cut for things such as worship service expenses, music supplies, community outreach and/or program expenses, or other discretionary items.

Once that adjusted budget has been approved by our Board of Directors, it will be presented to the Congregation for approval at our Annual Meeting in March.

Thank you for doing what you can to sustain this loving congregation where all are welcome and for helping to ensure that its many social justice activities continue.

COMMENTS:

- Revenue/Operating Income and Expenses:
- No unusual expenses were incurred. Budget control was good in December.
- Our Pledge Goal from April to December was \$152,632.00; and \$127,526.34 was received (83.6%). However, some congregants' pledge was received at the end of the last fiscal year (during the pledge drive); that amounted to \$22,600.00.
 Factoring in those funds, along with \$3,500 received in October 2023 for next year's pledge drive, we have received a total of \$146,626.34 (96.1%) towards the Pledge Goal. Thank you for your generosity!
- Several new accounts were created at Live Oak to generate increased interest income. The 1 Year CD rate is 5.0%. And the Savings rate is currently at 4.0%.
- The monthly transfer/deposit of \$1,250.00 to the Live Oak Capital Reserve account was made. A contract has been issued to repave the parking lot and we now expect that this work will be completed by March 2024. In addition, we have contracted for new front doors which we expect to have installed by March also. There were no Capital expenses in December.
- In December, \$608.00 was collected for Mano a Mano.

This event is organized by Xi Omicron Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity and the SWFL Alpha Educational & Leadership Foundation. Thanks to the efforts of Paul Leingang, LIFE's Lead Organizer, LIFE continues to increase its membership. A newly recruited church, The Community Church of Babcock Ranch, recently joined and Iona Hope Episcopal Church is re-activating its involvement in LIFE. Three additional churches plan to join this summer.

The Mental Health Action Team continues to research mental health issues facing our community. They are interviewing area mental health professionals associated with facilities that provide mental health services. Once all interviews are completed, MHAT members will identify a specific issue to be addressed and the decision-maker(s) who could implement an action that would improve the mental health landscape in Lee County. At its April 9th Nehemiah Action, those key decision makers will be asked to take the action(s) that LIFE has identified.

At Fort Myers City Council's February 5th meeting, the Council is seeking public input about proposed amendments to the Affordable Housing Trust Fund ordinance. The 4:30 pm meeting will be held in City Council Chambers, 2200 Second Street. You can support LIFE's efforts to influence the Council to award the funds in a manner that maximizes the number of low-income wage earners receiving Affordable Housing funds.

LEECARES HURRICANE IAN HOUSING RECOVERY PLAN

Fort Myers, FL, Jan. 16, 2024 – Lee County has announced that the application portal for the LeeCares Hurricane Ian Housing Recovery Program will open February 1. Door-to-door outreach to raise program awareness among individuals in need begins today, Jan. 16.

Outreach workers will fan out across the county to provide information to residents who were impacted by Hurricane Ian and who may qualify. The in-person outreach staff will be easily identifiable with the LeeCares logo on the front of shirts and "How Can I Help" on the back of shirts.

Outreach will continue even after the application portal opens. Areas to be visited this month and next include Dunbar and Tice, Fort Myers Shores and Franklin Park, Harlem Heights, Heritage Farms, Matlacha and Pine Island, North Fort Myers and Suncoast Estates, South Fort Myers Iona, Bonita Springs and Cape Coral, as well as many other areas. Additional outreach information and locations will be announced Feb. 1.

Funding for the LeeCares housing program comes from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Recovery allocation to Lee County to address the disaster recovery needs of residents impacted by Hurricane Ian, which made landfall in Lee County on Sept. 28, 2022.

The door-to-door outreach involves flyers, door hangers and other informational materials to educate the public about the LeeCares Hurricane Ian Housing Recovery Program. Informational materials will also be distributed through networks of community service organizations and through the mail.

The information will pertain to the two programs for which individuals can apply beginning Feb. 1:

- The Housing Rehabilitation, Reconstruction and Elevation program may assist income-eligible property owners to repair, replace and/or elevate property that suffered hurricane damage.
- The Home Purchase Assistance may assist incomeeligible home buyers to purchase a qualifying primary residence outside of the flood zone in Lee County.
